1. Clinician:

- Demonstrates knowledge of normal and abnormal human structure, function, and development.
- Applies knowledge to clinical problem-solving, diagnosis, and management.
- Performs a comprehensive and relevant physical examination.
- Provides preventive, promotive, curative, and palliative care.
- Maintains accurate and clear patient records.



2. Communicator:

- Communicates effectively with patients, families, and colleagues.
- Establishes positive and trusting relationships with patients.
- Respects patient preferences, values, and confidentiality.
- Encourages patient participation and shared decision-making.

3. Leader:

- Works effectively within healthcare teams, respecting diverse roles.
- Functions responsibly as a healthcare team leader in primary and secondary care settings.
- Educates and motivates other team members for collaborative care.
- Utilizes healthcare systems appropriately and cost-effectively.
- Advocates for quality improvement and patient safety.

4. Lifelong Learner:

- Performs self-assessment to identify knowledge and skill gaps.
- Continuously learns and refines existing skills while acquiring new ones.
- Applies new knowledge and skills to patient care.
- Critically appraises medical literature and integrates findings into practice.
- Identifies a fulfilling career pathway.

5. Professional:

- Acts with integrity, responsibility, and accountability.
- Maintains professional boundaries with patients and colleagues.
- Recognizes and manages ethical and professional conflicts.
- Abides by ethical and legal codes of conduct.
- Shows commitment to the growth of the medical profession.
